## Video showing Army...

The National Conference leader said while he understands the outrage generated across the country by the video in which CRPF personnel were seen being assaulted, he was enraged because the video of the youth tied to the jeep was not generating the same anger.

"I understand the outrage the CRPF video generated. I'm also outraged that the video of the youth on the jeep won't generate the same anger," he said. Amid the uproar over the videos, Chief Minister Mehbooba Mufti quickly got into action and sought a report from the state police on the "disturbing" videos of "unacceptable" incidents which have emerged from the Budgam district from the day of polling. The Chief Minister expressed concern over the videos being circulated on social media and has directed the police to submit a detailed report about the incidents so that necessary action could be taken, official sources said. Army was quick in ordering an inquiry. Defence ministry spokesperson, Colonel Rajesh Kalra, in a statement said: "The contents of the video are being verified and investigated. With internet services restored in Kashmir Valley on Thursday night after Sunday's deadly violence that led to the death of eight civilians in firing by security forces, many such videos emerged on social media sites on Friday. I have forcefully asked for consular access on the basis of international law and on humanitarian grounds as he is an Indian national." Apart from diplomatic options, India is also exploring legal remedies permitted under Pakistan's legal system.

Foreign Secretary Janjua said the trial against Jhadev was conducted under the Pakistan Army Act 1952 and Official Secret Act of 1923, according to a statement. She said that during the period of trial, "due judicial process was followed and he was provided a lawyer in accordance with relevant laws and the constitution of Pakistan". Janjua alleged that the Pakistanis "incarcerated" in Indian prisons have not been provided consular access for years, despite repeated requests and follow-up by the Pakistan High Commission in New Delhi. ■

## In this mobile data war, consumers are truly the king

With Reliance Jio continuing with its free services under the Jio Dhan Dhana Dhan offer, the country's three biggest telecom operators — Airtel, Vodafone and Idea — have launched data-heavy offers in a bid to retain their users. The offers by all three operators seem to be personalised for individual users, based on their usage patterns.

With such data-heavy offers, Airtel, Vodafone and Idea aim to keep users from enrolling for the Jio Prime service and get free services for three months. The launch of these customised offers is very close to the last date for signing up for Jio Prime at Rs 99.

Mukesh Ambani-owned Reliance Jio had recently announced the Jio Dhan Dhana Dhan offer which it calls its new 'all unlimited' plan offering free unlimited SMS, voice calling and data with 1GB 4G capping per day for 84 days on first recharge.

The company also announced that it was finally pulling the plug on its Summer Surprise offer following the TRAI advisory. Jio has introduced two types of plans under its new offer — one for Prime members and the other for non-prime members.

## Omar's failure to check stone-pelting in 2010 led to current situation: Mehbooba

Jammu

J&K chief Mehbooba Mufti on Friday said the "failure" of the previous Omar Abdullah government to deal with the issue of stone-pelting had led to the unrest last year and the situation in the Valley at present.

Her remarks came as a response to National Conference chief Farooq Abdullah, who had on Thursday said the Mufti government was "financing stone-pelting". "There were no measures taken with regard to the youths, who took to the streets to hurl stones (in 2010). What steps were taken at that time to check stone-pelting? No treatment was done. It is because of the failure to take steps to treat the ailment. It churned lava (in youths), which exploded suddenly last year and till now, we have not been able to stop this," Mehbooba said.

On Abdullah's charge, she said: "The NC had in 2010 said the PDP, which was in the opposition at that time, was giving money to stone-



pelers. Now, Farooq Abdullah is saying the PDP government is paying boys and youths for throwing stones. "Some time ago, Farooq sahab himself said they all (stone-pelters) are nationalists and now he is saying all those nationalists are being paid by the PDP government to resort to stone-pelting. I think Farooq sahab is confused." She said her father Mufti Mohammad Sayeed worked to find a solution to the 70-year-old Kashmir issue but no headway was made in this direction after his tenure ended.

The CM said her government was committed to healing "the wounds of Kashmir and restoring normalcy in the Valley. We will work to bring the state out of the unfortunate situation". ■

## DigiDhan will become voice of poor, curb corruption: Modi

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Friday said the 'DigiDhan' movement was not only about curbing corruption, but also about giving a voice to the poor. He also launched two schemes, giving a further push to the Centre's efforts to create a less-cash system, on the 126th birth anniversary of social justice crusader BR Ambedkar. Modi, who paid tribute to Ambedkar at Deekshabhoomi, where the Dalit icon had embraced Buddhism, linked the new schemes with his vision of social justice and financial empowerment.

"We have been working towards a digital India for quite some time. DigiDhan is one of the initiatives which will become 'niji dhan' (personal wealth) of

the poor. It will become the voice of the poor," he told a public meeting here. "The DigiDhan movement is a safai abhiyan (cleanliness

movement). It is to fight the menace of corruption," he said. The prime minister launched the BHIM-Aadhaar Pay app, a biometric-

BHIM — cashback and referral bonus — with an outlay of Rs 495 crore for a period of six months.

Seeking to rope in youngsters to promote cashless transactions, Modi said for every person introduced to the BHIM app, one will get a cashback of Rs 10. "If you refer 20 persons a day, you can earn Rs 200," he said. Under the referral bonus scheme, both the existing users who refer BHIM and new users who adopt it would get a cash bonus which will be credited directly to their bank account. Under the cashback scheme, the merchants will get a cashback on every transaction on BHIM. Both the schemes will be administered by the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology and implemented by the National

Payments Corporation of India.

BHIM-Aadhaar, the merchant interface of the BHIM app, paves the way for digital payments through the Aadhaar platform. This will enable the citizens to pay digitally using the biometric data like thumb imprint on a merchant's biometric-enabled device, which could be a smartphone with a biometric data reader. Anyone without access to smartphones, internet, debit or credit cards will be able to transact digitally through the BHIM-Aadhaar platform.

"This will make digital payments easy even for those who cannot read or write, thus realising Ambedkar's vision of social and financial empowerment for all," Modi said. ■

## Only employer will decide if employee's work satisfactory: HC

New Delhi

An employer, not a court, will decide whether a probationary employee's services are satisfactory, the Delhi High Court has said. Justice Valmiki Mehta made the observation while upholding the termination of services of a teacher by a private school in the national capital. "Whether or not a probationary employee's services are satisfactory, it is for the employer to decide ... and this court cannot substitute its view for that of the employer with respect to satisfactory services or otherwise of employee with the employer," the court said.

The school had terminated the services of a teacher

in March 2014 after keeping him on probation for nearly three years as his work was not found to be satisfactory. The teacher had challenged the decision in the Delhi School Tribunal (DST) which on December 10, 2015 had ruled in his favour by ordering his reinstatement. The school had challenged the DST's decision in the high court which set aside the tribunal's order, holding the termination of his service as valid.

It said that since the man, who was appointed on April 4, 2011, did not complete three years of service in the school, he would not be entitled to be confirmed as an employee as was ruled by the Delhi High Court in another matter in 2013. ■

## Now, BJP to focus on states crucial for its fortunes in 2019

New Delhi

Having reclaimed power in Uttar Pradesh after 15 years, the BJP will now turn its focus to the states where it has been traditionally weak but which are critical to determine its fortune in the 2019 Lok Sabha polls as its national executive meet begins in Odisha on Saturday.

Gaining strength in the eastern states, including West Bengal, is on the top of BJP president Amit Shah's to-do list now. Prime Minister Narendra Modi, besides Shah himself are likely to give a call for pushing the party's expansion in the new territories. After arriving in the city, Shah

paid tributes to Dalit icon Bhim Rao Ambedkar on his birth anniversary and later joined his state party colleagues in celebrating the Odia new year. The BJP organised a motorcycle rally to welcome him.

He was also presented with a garland of 74 "victory flowers", a reference to the majority mark in the 147-seat Odisha assembly. The BJP has also planned a virtual road show for Modi when he arrives here tomorrow. He is likely to be greeted at several places on his road travel from airport to Raj Bhawan, where he will stay.

Union minister Dharmendra Pradhan

called Odisha a "laboratory" of the pro-poor policies of the Modi government as he hit out at the state government a day before the executive begins. Modi will also felicitate the members of 16 families associated with an 1817 rebellion in Odisha against the British rule.

Continuing with the BJP's dalit outreach, the party has named the venue of its executive meet after noted Odia poet and reformer Bhima Bhoi. Dalits constitute over 17 per cent of the state's electorate and have never been traditional voters of the saffron party, which is now wooing them aggressively. ■

## SC asks Centre to mull extending financial benefits to para forces

New Delhi

The Supreme Court has asked the Centre to re-think on the issue whether paramilitary forces — CRPF, BSF, ITBP, CISF and SSB — can be given monetary benefits like the "organised services".

The apex court was hearing a batch of appeals including one filed by the Centre against the Delhi High Court's September 2015 verdict asking the government to consider all paramilitary forces as "organised services". The high court had said officers of paramilitary forces should be given the benefits including non-functional financial upgradation (NFU), earlier available to 'Group A organised services', from 2006 in terms of the 6th Pay Commission.

Under NFU, if all the officers of a particular batch cannot move up the ladder owing to lack of vacancies but only one does, the others will automatically get financial upgradation like the one who has been promoted. Solicitor General Ranjit Kumar, representing

the Centre, told the apex court if the paramilitary forces were declared as organised group 'A' services, there cannot be any deputation and no one from IPS cadre can come on deputation.

The apex court said it perceives that the paramilitary forces personnel were grieved by the non-grant of 'equal pay for equal work', a benefit granted to the organised services, and if the conferment of monetary benefit can assuage their grievance, the government might think over it. "In the ultimate eventuate, we think it apt to say that if the conferment of monetary benefit can assuage the grievance of the respondents, the Union of India may rethink over the matter without disturbing its sense of discipline as it conceives," a bench comprising Justices Dipak Misra and M M Shantanagoudar said. "The personnel of BSF, CRPF, ITBP, PPF and SSB are to play their role in their duties. Though we have framed the issues that will be required to be addressed, yet we would like

the Union of India to take a decision, as advised, so that the respondents may feel that their grievances have been appositely addressed," the court said.

The bench, which granted 12 weeks to the Centre to deliberate upon the issue, further said, "The respondents, as we perceive, are grieved by non-grant of equal pay for equal work, that is, benefit that has been granted to the organised services". "If that is the case, we would like the respondents to file their duty chart in respect of each of the forces. The petitioners shall also file the duty chart and the job allocation so that a comparison can be made that can render assistance in the process of adjudication," it said and fixed the matter for hearing on August 9.

The apex court has framed three issues for consideration, including whether the Home Ministry was alone responsible for taking a decision or other departments can confer the benefit of equivalence subject to approval by the Cabinet. ■

## Imposing only fine on woman convict in serious case unfair: SC

New Delhi

The Supreme Court has held that imposing only a fine in serious offences, which entail award of jail terms and fine both, on women convicts would lead to "unfair" and "unjust" consequences. Observing this, the apex court set aside the Himachal Pradesh High Court verdict imposing only a fine on a woman, who was convicted of drugging and taking part in robbing a man, and said leniency cannot be shown beyond what has been allowed in the statutory scheme.

A bench, comprising Justices A K Sikri and Ashok Bhushan, who wrote separate but concurring verdicts, said the convict was already shown leniency by the trial court on the ground that she has three minor kids. The trial court awarded her a two-year jail term and a fine of Rs 6,000. The High Court raised this fine to Rs 30,000 and allowed the woman to walk free.

Justice Sikri said "In the present case, two mitigating circumstances which are pressed into service by the respondent (accused) are that she is a woman and she is having three minor children. This has to be balanced with the nature of crime which the respondent has committed. "As can be seen,

these circumstances were taken into consideration by the trial court and on that basis, the trial court took a lenient view by awarding imprisonment for two years in respect of each of the offences under Sections 307, 328 and 392 of the IPC, which were to be run concurrently. "There was no reason to show any further mercy by the High Court. Further, as found above, removing the element of imprisonment altogether was, in any case, erroneous in law," the judge said. Justice Bhushan was harsher in his observations and said, "Appellate Court cannot exercise its power under 386(b)(iii) to alter the sentence of the imprisonment and fine into a sentence of only a fine, which shall be contrary to the statutory scheme.

The verdict came on an appeal against the High Court order which modified the trial court order and imposed the fine only on her. It was alleged that the woman had helped a man rob another of Rs 27,000 by administering drinks laced with sedatives in August 2000 in Himachal Pradesh. A Chamber trial court had convicted her and awarded two-year jail term, besides fine. Thereafter, she approached the High Court of Himachal Pradesh against the trial court order. ■

## Selfie deaths prompt railways advisory

Kolkata

A day after the selfie craze inside a running train led to the deaths of several youths, the Eastern Railway authorities on Friday appealed to passengers to be careful and issued guidelines.

A railway spokesman said they have already launched campaigns in print, television and social media to make passengers aware of the risks of using phones while travelling. In a horrific turn of events, a youth fell from a running train between Bali and Liluah railway stations while trying to click a selfie on Thursday night.

Four of his friends were hit by another train while rushing towards the acci-

dent spot.

According to eyewitnesses, the four friends got down at Bali station and started running through the railway track when a speeding train knocked them down, killing three on the spot and severely injuring the fourth.

"We have launched campaigns in various media platforms urging people not to use a phone or listen to music while crossing the railway tracks and not to click photographs while travelling," Chief Public Relations Officer of Eastern Railways Rabi Mahapatra said on Friday.

Stating that photography is "strictly prohibited" inside the railway station premises and trains

without prior permission, he warned passengers of strict action if the rules are not followed.

"Photography inside the railway stations and the carriages is always strictly prohibited as these are considered restricted areas.

However, with the emergence of phone cameras people often indulge in taking selfies in these places," Mahapatra explained.

"We have detained and fined several passengers in the past for breaking the rule.

Our RPF officials are instructed to monitor the passengers and catch anyone clicking photographs inside the train compartment. Anyone breaking the rule would be penalised," he added.
